Self, Sorrow, Sorrows Healed, Suffering

A popular song has a line that says, "Earth has no sorrow that heaven can't heal". What a great line! There is no sorrow that heaven can't heal, but if heaven can heal them all, why do we have them in the first place? That's a great question! Where does sorrow come from? Some say from God—that He's using them to teach us a lesson or build character in us. Does that really make sense? Why would He put hurt in our lives and then promise to heal us? And, He did promise just that. Psalm 34:19 says, "A righteous man may have many troubles, but the Lord delivers him from them all."

So, then, where does sorrow come from? From us! We, as in mankind, we did it. James said, "When tempted, no one should say, 'God is tempting me.' For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does He tempt anyone, but each one is tempted when, by his own evil desire, he is dragged away and enticed Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death" (James 1:13-15). But, it's not necessarily our sin that causes us trouble; it's sin in general. God put two special trees in the garden of Eden—the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, or you could say, the tree of innocence lost. One had unrestricted access; the other had a skull-and-crossbones warning, "Don't eat this or you will die." We know what happened.
